


What is the illustration glossary?

The **illustration glossary** is a Designated Support for mathematics to help students understand words or phrases in test questions when they may not benefit from the text-based glossaries (currently offered in English and 13 other languages) or American Sign Language videos.

The illustration glossary is available for practice tests, interim assessments, fixed-form summative assessments, and paper-pencil assessments. An adaptive version for the summative assessment is being developed for future years.



Which students most benefit from the illustration glossary?

- Students with varying proficiency in one of the current translated glossary languages who would benefit from current illustration supports
- Students who are deaf/hard of hearing and use sign systems other than American Sign Language
